Appropriate instruction in boat carrying, access/egress techniques, boat emptying, rescues etc. Heavy equipment to be carried by 2 or 4 persons. appropriate clothing. Coaches to promote cooperation between paddlers and coaches paddlers when moving involved with the session equipment.
Advice given on correct clothing to wear. No beginners' sessions where capsize is likely in cold weather. No juniors or novices allowed on river without clothing check. Coaches cover First Aid course. All qualified coaches hold first involved with the session informed of minimum
Minor cuts to be covered. For more serious wounds paddling should be avoided. Advise all participants to wash their hands immediately afterwards and to shower as soon as possible and to follow good personal hygiene before eating. Medical attention sought if involved with the session symptoms persist.
Novices not allowed on water unsupervised. Buoyancy aids worn as directed by coaches. Paddle UK marathon rules as minimum. Paddlers made aware of entrapment by overhanging trees and tree roots. Land based users warned of steep and unstable banks. Buoyancy aids visually checked annually. Checks on condition of buoyancy aids during the season. Throw-line (s) available.
Novices not allowed on the water unsupervised. Buoyancy aids worn as directed by coaches. Paddle UK assist a paddler who has marathon rules as minimum. Adequate buoyancy in all club boats Group to support and All paddlers and coaches involved with the session
